Scripture Intro Introduction

Proposition: We must respond to the superior promise in faithful worship

- I. Because God is the Judge, we must worship in awe (vs. 18-21, 25-27, 29)
 - **A.** Unapproachably holy (vs.18-29) (Ex. 19:12-25; 20:18-21; Dt. 18:16): "You have not come to what may be touched...They could not endure the order..."
 - **B. Sovereignly terrifying (v. 21) (Dt. 9:19):** "I tremble with fear..."
 - C. Eternally condemning (vs. 25-27, 29): "our God is a consuming fire."
- II. Because God is the Redeemer, we must worship in gratitude (vs. 22-24, 28)
 - A. A living God (v. 22)
 - **B.** A joyful community (v. 22): "in festal gathering..."
 - C. Assembly of heirs (v. 23): "to the assembly of the firstborn"
 - **D.** Absolutely secure (v. 23): "enrolled in heaven...righteous made perfect."
 - E. A better blood (v. 24): "to Jesus...sprinkled blood."
 - **F.** Acceptable worship (v. 28): "grateful for receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken."
