Noteworthy performances include appearances at National Directors' Seminars for the American Guild of English Handbell Ringers in Reston, Virginia (1991); in Mobile, Alabama (1994); and in Palm Springs, California (2001). The group has toured England, Bermuda, Germany, Japan, France, Switzerland, Austria, The Netherlands, Italy, and in July, 2012 Carillon will perform a concert tour of France with concerts at Chartres Cathedral in Chartres; Church of Saint Pierre in Arromanches; and The American Church in Paris.
