PREPARATION FOR WORSHIP

This morning's liturgy incorporates two unique psalm texts. Psalm 34 is a psalm of praise, and Psalm 121 is a psalm of ascent, which were the songs that worshippers sang up the hill to Jerusalem for the major festivals of the church. The psalms are certainly the church's "book of worship," as they express all range of emotions to our God — praise, thanksgiving and lament. They communicate the same sentiments today as they did 2,000 years ago, and we join with the psalmists and the church universal by singing and reading the Word of God.
