## Preparation for Worship

As you enter the Sanctuary, please prepare your heart for worship and silence your mobile devices.

The early Christians observed with great devotion the days of our Lord's passion and resurrection, and it became the custom of the Church that before the Easter celebration there should be a 40-day season of spiritual preparation. This 40-day season became known as Lent.

During this season, converts to the faith were prepared for baptism. Also, persons who had fallen into grievous sin and had separated themselves from the community of faith were reconciled by repentance and forgiveness and were restored to participation in the life of the Church. In this way God's people were reminded of the mercy and forgiveness proclaimed in the Gospel of Jesus Christ and the need we all have to renew our faith.

We invite you, therefore, in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, to observe this 40-day period of preparation by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's Holy Word.

### **Prayer of Preparation**

Almighty God, whose blessed Son was led by the Spirit to be tested and tempted by Satan; come quickly to help us who are assaulted by many temptations; and, as You know the weaknesses of each of us, let each one find You mighty to save; through Jesus Christ Your Son our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

## God's Wondrous Christ

**Paraments for the Season of Lent:** Embroidered upon the purple pulpit fall in gold thread are the Greek letters *Chi* and *Rho*, the first two letters of the Greek word *XPICTOC*, Christos, together with the letters *Alpha* and *Omega*, the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet, representing Christ, the beginning of all things, and the end. The *Chi Rho* symbols are a Christogram (monogram) of Christ. On the two Bible markers, also in gold thread, the letter *Alpha* is on one side and *Omega* on the other.
