II. We must submit to Jesus as our king

Cf. Mt. 15:22; 20:30, 31; Mt. 21:9, 15.

III. We must worship Jesus as one greater than David

Cf. Acts 2:29, 34; Ps. 110; Mt. 22:45

IV. We must trust Jesus as the conqueror of all our enemies

Cf. Rev. 3:7; 5:5; 22:16

1. Why does Matthew emphasize Jesus' descent from David? What difference does this make to us?
2. How should we behave if we are submitting to Jesus as King? In what ways would we see the church's conduct change if she were in submission to Him?
3. How does the New Testament say that Jesus is greater than David? What does this mean for us?
4. How are the conquests of Jesus similar to the conquests of David? How are they different?
5. How does Jesus' complete fulfillment of God's promise to David shed light on the events of I and II Samuel?

Going Deeper

1. What doctrinal truths have you learned from I and II Samuel that are most important to you?
2. What practical lessons have you learned from I and II Samuel that are most valuable to you?
