Third Sunday of Advent



A Word on Worship

As you enter the Sanctuary, please prepare your heart for worship and silence your mobile devices.

Stir up your power, O Lord, and with great might come among us; and, because we are sorely hindered by our sins, let Your bountiful grace and mercy speedily help and deliver us; through Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom, with You and the Holy Spirit, be honor and glory, now and forever. Amen.

The above prayer of preparation succinctly reminds us of three truths:

First of all, Jesus is among us. Let us not take it for granted that Jesus Christ comes among his church when we gather for worship. Hebrews 2:12 tells us what He does when He comes: "I will tell of your name to my brothers; in the midst of the congregation I will sing your praise." Let us pray that the Lord would come among us and make Himself, His name and His works known to us in life-transforming ways.

Secondly, we are sorely hindered by sin. Our sin greatly offends God because it causes us to turn our loyalty, energy, and desire away from God to other things and people. Therefore, it is imperative that we take time in corporate worship to confess our sins (I John 1:9) and forsake them (Proverbs 29:13). This exercise causes Jesus and His gospel to become more beautiful and precious to us.

Thirdly, God's grace and mercy alone save us. There's something unique about Jesus; he is the long-awaited Messiah who takes away the sin of the world (John 1:29). We cannot save ourselves. Our only hope for salvation is God's grace demonstrated to us in our Lord Jesus Christ.

These three truths alone should motivate us for joyful worship. Let us prepare to worship our God.
