A Word on Worship

As you enter the Sanctuary, please prepare your heart for worship and silence your mobile devices.

In corporate worship, we invest extended time in prayer. We do this primarily because God commands us to seek Him in prayer. Prayer also serves as one of the main ways that we exercise our faith in God as well as an antidote for our anxious hearts (Luke 18:1; Philippians 4:6-7).

If you have attempted to pray at all, you recognize that prayer is hard work and that all of us struggle to pray well. Therefore, we constantly need our Lord's guidance. This is why we regularly use the Lord's Prayer as a pattern for our own praying.

According to the Lord's Prayer, evil exists in the world and has its origin in the Evil One. All of us easily succumb to His agenda when we profane God's name, oppose God's kingdom, resist God's will, fail to forgive those who sin against us, and fail to resist temptation. On the contrary, Jesus' prayer empowers us to refocus on the Lord: His praise, His program, His plan, His provision, His pardon, and His protection.

Today when we bow our heads and hearts in prayer, let us remember that we are participating with our Lord in His uprising against the disorder of our hearts and our world. Let us ask Him to strengthen our capacity to trust Him for He has promised to rescue us from our perilous life on earth and bring us safely home to heaven.
