GENEVA CONFESSION (1536/37), Section 1 Rev. Joey Donahue Providence Reformed Associate Presbyterian Church

First we declare that for the rule of faith and religion, we wish to follow the Scriptures alone, without mixing with it any other thing which might be fabricated by the opinion of men apart from the Word of God; and we do not pretend to receive any other doctrine for our spiritual government than that which is taught us by the same Word, without addition or reduction, according to the command of our Lord.

"All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be competent, equipped for every good work." II Timothy 3:16-17

As the word trains us in righteousness, let us make confession to the Lord:

Almighty, eternal God and Father,

nor follow Your holy commandments.
