The mission of Advance Memphis is to serve adults in the former Cleaborn and current Foote community of Memphis by empowering residents to acquire knowledge, resources, and skills to be economically self-sufficient through the gospel of Jesus Christ. Advance offers Jobs for Life classes, financial literacy class, and job training.

OPPORTUNITIES

Champion Provide one-on-one assistance and mentoring to a Jobs for Life participant as he/she pursues employment. The goal is to build relationships with Jobs for Life participants while encouraging them to apply the principles of God's Word to all areas of life: career, finances, and family. This is an opportunity for real impact.

Allies This mentoring role is similar to the Champion role described above, with a focus on personal finance. Allies support participants in class to use their finances as a part of His Kingdom work through relational encouragement and accountability. Visit website for a class calendar.

Office Help Assist staff with the daily activities associated with running an office. This can include data entry, light cleaning, and clerical duties. Times are very flexible within the workday.

Lunch Providers When the Jobs for Life class is in session, volunteers provide lunch for the students. These volunteers are providing more than just a meal—they are providing a time for fellowship and relationship building that is vital to the work at Advance Memphis. Lunch providers would provide lunch for approximately 20 students for one day.

GED Tutors Volunteer tutors work closely with students to help them prepare for the GED exam. Tutors are needed in all subject areas: grammar, writing, math, science, and history. Most tutoring opportunities are during normal workday hours.

Computer/Lab Assistants Help students/graduates with resumes, job searches, internet navigation, email, and basic Word documents. This can be a regularly recurring role, or more occasional, depending on the volunteer's availability. Computer lab assistants are usually needed in the morning, one day a week.

Mock Interviewers Prepare students for actual job interviews by advising a small group on basic interview tips and walking them through mock interviews. Each six week Jobs for Life class has one mock interview workshop which lasts from about 10:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m., so a volunteer participant could participate from 1-6 times a year in this role.

Childcare Providers Serve our evening students by providing childcare, so parents are able to attend classes. Various evenings are available for this volunteer position.

Bethany seeks to promote healthy families providing adoption (both domestic and international) and counseling services. A special program, the Safe Families initiative, provides temporary care for children of families experiencing a crisis, thereby preventing the children from being taken into the state's custody.

Birth Mother Support Recognition Coordinator Plan an event(s) that will honor and lift up the birth mothers, such as a luncheon or an outing on Birth Mother's Day, the Saturday before Mother's Day.

Special Events Helper Assist with various special events throughout the year. There are many areas in which help: promoting the event, helping with mailings, to working the event.

Serve on a committee We are always in need of people to volunteer to serve on the committees with board and staff to work on events like the banquet and bike ride events, and develop other events including fun events for birth mothers, and adoptive families.

SAFE FAMILIES

Host Family Provide temporary housing for child/children of families that are having a family crisis.
