Advance Memphis serves adults in the 38126 community Memphis by empowering residents to acquire knowledge, resources, and skills to be economically self-sufficient through the gospel of Jesus Christ.

FACILITATORS Provide one-on-one assistance and mentoring to a Jobs for Life participant (Champion). Support participants in Faith & Finance class with a focus on finance (Allies) and work with participants in the LAUNCH class (Mentor).

MEAL PROVIDERS We need meals for lunch during Jobs for Life and dinner during our Faith & Finances class. We love it all: homemade food or delivered pizza!

TUTORS Volunteer tutors help GED/High School Equivalency students study for the test by providing one-on-one help with problem areas.

MOCK INTERVIEWERS Carefully prep participants for job interviews; then, mock interviewers take them through their paces and provide feedback.

PRAYER PARTNERS Prayer Team members receive about two prayer letter emails a month and lift up the specific requests of our participants and our staff. It is a tremendous blessing to tell our new class members that a few hundred people are praying for them.

EcOp is a second chance program for ex-offenders. EcOp equips them spiritually with weekly Bible studies, GED skills training, financial literacy, and providing skills and resources needed to obtain stable employment.

BOARD MEMBER Volunteers are needed to serve on the board.

Eikon Ministries works in the Binghampton and Orange Mound areas. Many 2PC families participate in Nathan Street Ministries, one of its more active programs. Children from ages 5-18 attend Bible study and club meetings. Eikon leaders serve in most Binghampton schools (Lester/Cornerstone, Brewster, and East). Eikon promotes mentoring relationships for children and seeks to equip children with resources in leadership, biblical teaching, life skills, and financial literacy.

EEC targets at-risk youth ages 5-19 in the Cleborn Homes housing community in 38126. These services include: after-school activities, Bible clubs, field trips to local museums, youth job placement, Camp HOPE (Helping Our Participants Excel), and sports and recreation programs.

HOMEWORK HELPERS Monday-Thursday from 3:30-5:30 p.m. during the school year. Volunteers may commit to coming as little as once a month up to four days a week.

READING, MATH OR SCIENCE TUTORS Monday-Thursday from 3:30-5:30 p.m. during the school year (commit to once a month or up to four days a week).

COACHING Volunteers will coach sports. We offer basketball, baseball, touch football, t-ball, soccer, tennis, kickball, and more at various times during the year. Most teams meet twice a week, including games on Saturday mornings.

S.A.F.E. (SET ASIDE FOR EXCELLENCE) AND PRIMETIME Volunteers will mentor teens socially, spiritually, and/or in the area of college readiness or career development. S.A.F.E. volunteer opportunities are offered Monday-Thursday from 3:30-5:00 pm. Primetime volunteer opportunities are offered Wednesday from 6:00-7:30 p.m.

JIFF is a Christ-centered court-referred intervention program targeting delinquent 12-18 year olds. JIFF provides four months of transitional intervention services focusing on building life skills and providing biblical instruction needed to break the destructive cycle of criminal behavior.

MALE VOLUNTEERS can get involved in the new Lets Live Life Mentor program that is designed to share, teach, and demonstrate the principles of manhood to young men, help identify dreams, and inspire futures. Volunteers will commit to two weekends a month for six months and “Live Life” together with a mentee.

Knightlife is a 2PC ministry to young men (16 and up) which meets Friday s ONLY from 6:30-9:00 p.m. in the 2PC recreation area. The program begins with Bible study and small groups followed by a meal. The youth end the program playing basketball.

One by One's mission is to impact an entire generation by enriching the quality of life for babies and their parents through God's Word. 2PC Women's Ministry Department facilitates involvement with the ministry by connecting an expectant teen with a mentor (2PC member). The mentors provide spiritual support as well as prenatal support. Hickory Hill, Alcy Ball, and Frayser Community are some of the communities that are served by the ministry.

PRAYER PARTNERS Each mentor is assigned a prayer partner who studies the same Bible studies that the mentor does. The prayer partner prays constantly with the mentor—including by phone and in person. Prayer partners pray especially during the time the mentor makes her visit with her participant mom.

MENTORS Volunteers are paired with at-risk expectant and new parents referred to their church's One by One Ministry through the coordinator. Mentors make once-a-month visits with participant moms (and family) with contact occurring weekly or more often. During the visit, the mentors help moms build a baby book that contains valuable parenting information. Mentors provide encouragement, share Christ, serve as role models for their moms, and assist parents in developing an effective support network that fosters their parenting life skills and provides for family services if needed. The commitment is from the prenatal months through the first year of a baby's life, an average of about 18 months.
