- **1.** *Clear Christian Testimony.* The successful candidate will be able to articulate clearly her relationship with Jesus Christ and profess a well-grounded and vital faith.
- Theological Agreement with the Distinctives of the Westminster Confession of Faith and the Confessional Statement of The Gospel Coalition. The successful candidate will be conversant with the distinctives of the Reformed faith and be able to articulate them.
- 3. Academic Credentials. The successful candidate will preferably hold a graduate and/or seminary degree in Christian education, counseling, spiritual formation, theology or biblical studies.
- **4. Experience.** The successful candidate will have at least five years of leadership experience in directing programs that strengthen and encourage women in their personal relationships with the Lord and with each other.
- 5. **Possess biblical knowledge to support counseling and educational activities.** The successful candidate will have a sound theology grounded in the truths of scripture with the ability to discerningly apply the Bible to every dimension of life.
- 6. **Possess an ability to develop and nurture programs that inspire spiritual growth.** The successful candidate will have access to a network of ministry partners and possess a collection of resources to effectively guide women in cultivating a heart for God with a commitment that translates into compassionate and helpful ministries for the church, for the community, and for the world.
- 7. **Ability to work as a part of teams.** The successful candidate will show evidence of her ability and wisdom in working with teams of laypersons, support staff, pastors, and event planners in creating, analyzing, and conducting focal activities of the church.
