PRAY FOR YOUR MISSIONARIES

Listen to how Paul prayed for the Ephesians in Ephesians 3:14–19:

For this reason I bow my knees before the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named, that according to the riches of his glory he may grant you to be strengthened with power through his Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith—that you, being rooted and grounded in love, may have strength to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled with all the fullness of God.

Let us follow Paul's example by praying that our missionaries, and those whom they serve, might be strengthened by Christ in their inner being, and that they might experience God to the fullest.

Ideas on Prayer for our Missionaries

PRAY that they will have a consistent, meaningful devotional life and good times in the Word.

PRAY for strong marriages, good parenting skills, and for the missionaries' families in their home countries.

PRAY for their emotional needs—an assurance of God's love and presence.

PRAY for their adaptability to the culture, fluency in the language, and good relationships with national workers.

PRAY for the people whom they serve, that they might meet Jesus, be transformed by the Gospel, and be equipped to proclaim the Gospel faithfully to their own people.

PRAY for unity and maturity in the national churches that are being established.

Malawi

Our engagement in Malawi focuses on supporting local church empowerment and mobilization activities with churches in the Ntchisi district. Currently, 213 local churches partner with World Relief, which helps them to implement health, economic, and social development programs. The goal is to build the capacity of local churches to lead the holistic development among the most vulnerable in their community.

PRAYER REQUESTS

- For the development of leaders who can train other leaders to care for the vulnerable, and that the local churches can mobilize effective personal care that empowers the under-resourced
- For Fletcher and Damaseko as they direct World Relief in Ntchisi and serve trainers and pastors in the program

Mozambique

We partner with World Relief Mozambique, which works to establish Spiritual Transformation Groups among the rural poor in the Gaza province in southern Mozambique. Xavier Massingue works with four trainers, Armando, Castro, Betina, and Alson, who equip pastors and church leaders to disciple members of their own churches. The churches provide both spiritual and physical care for their communities through programs for maternal and child health, HIV/AIDS awareness, community savings, and agricultural projects. By equipping local church leaders, our strategy is to bring grassroots spiritual transformation in the villages of Mozambique.

In 2012, college friends asked Jason Hood to help them find a pastor for their church in Moshi, Tanzania. At the time, Emily and Jason were caregivers for her parents, so the Hoods did not even consider the position for themselves. Several months later, Jason and Emily realized the Lord had kept the position open because He was calling them to serve there. After much prayer and consideration, the Hood family moved to Moshi in October 2013, where Jason became pastor of St. Margaret's Anglican Church, an international English-speaking church. Moshi is a large town in the foothills of Mt. Kilimanjaro which attracts foreign tourists and residents who come to volunteer or work. Many of these English-speaking expats and tourists are lonely and attend church in order to meet people from "home." The Hoods hope that many of these without a saving faith will come to know Christ. They are very thankful for the relatively uneventful transition their family has made in moving to a new culture.

Judy is founder and CEO of Homecare Spiritual Fellowship (HSF), a ministry devoted to equipping women in Kenya to provide for themselves and their children. HSF focuses on several programs. The HIV/AIDS Women's Program brings women touched by the disease together to address their physical and spiritual needs, and also helps care for their children who may or may not also be infected. The Group Savings and Loan program teaches participants to save money and how to loan to each other. The Dress-Making Program is a school where girls from the Kibera slum learn a skill that enables them to provide a living for themselves. Branching out from the compound is the ministry to orphans, which consists of a Bible club and feeding program in partnership with six churches. Judy also has a ministry to the Maasai women and the Homecare Retreat Center.

When Stephen, Marion and their then 4-month-old son arrived in Malawi years ago, the college consisted of 50 acres of maize fields and wild animals. Today, ABC is a four-year, liberal arts college with campuses in Malawi, Uganda and Liberia where they train, nurture and develop Africa's next generation of Christian leaders. Marion serves as hospitality and social coordinator for staff and students. This past summer, Stephen and a surfer friend from the US started a paddleboard ministry on Lake Malawi. By the end of the first day, they had over 500 kids playing in soccer matches, hearing Bible lessons, singing worship songs, playing games, and riding the waves. In addition, about 100 adults were viewing the Jesus film and hearing the Gospel in this predominately Islamic area.

In August, the government of Uganda recognized the contribution of the UBI ministry in light of the UN Millennium Goals, and awarded Johnson with the Pearl of Africa Lifetime Achievement Award. Most of the graduates have been ordained or commissioned to serve in churches, schools, and other institutions. We have partnered with the City to City network that has championed the cause of the center city by building networks of church planters who love the city and seek to minister to those whose native culture are the mega-cities of today. The postmodern mindset and the cultural and moral pluralities of today's urban lifestyle pose complex questions that cry out for fresh approaches to controversial and explosive topics. The Church must respond to this rapid change in the demographic of the world's population if we are to engage today's urban population with the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

We have developed relationships with church planters in Prague, Pottsdam, Berlin, and Budapest, as well as in Rotterdam and Rome, who are engaging both postmodern urbanites and the many non-Western residents of their cities with the Gospel message. The atheistic and materialistic core of the cities is being challenged by the living faith of new communities.

The multicultural face of these cities, full of "New Europeans" from North Africa, the Middle East, and Central Asia, are being engaged with compassion and kindness in a way that invites exploration of the person and work of Jesus.

Missions is something that God has placed on Patience's heart since she was a child. Growing up, mission conferences at church were always her favorite events to attend. In college she went on two separate mission trips to Quito, Ecuador. It was on one of these trips that the Lord first lit the fire in her heart for the nations. During her junior year at Belmont University, she made the decision to get experience as a nurse before pursuing overseas missions. She was able to connect with some dear missionary friends in Bulgaria who asked her to join their team. She accepted the call to serve with the MTW Bulgaria team on an 11-month internship beginning in May 2013. Patience is using her nursing to serve with the Daughters of Bulgaria ministry (an outreach ministry to the women involved in prostitution and sex trafficking), and a special needs ministry. Along with fellow First Responder, Katie Kimbro, Patience ministers to Bulgarian university students and young adults through English clubs and ESL training.

Annoor Sanatorium

The Annoor Sanatorium in Mafraq, Jordan, continues to serve the Bedouins of the region by providing inpatient treatment for tuberculosis. While in the hospital, patients are given the opportunity to attend Bible studies and discussion groups with the staff and other patients, and many hear of the saving work of Jesus for the first time.

The hospital simultaneously runs an outpatient clinic that treats many people, including visiting workers from countries like Yemen and Bangladesh (which can make communication complex when the patients don't speak English or Arabic). The hospital also has a mobile dental clinic which treats patients at Annoor and other sites during the year.

We also partner more broadly in the Middle East with AWEMA, the Arab World Evangelical Minsters Association, to train and equip pastors and church leaders throughout the Arab speaking world.

In 2000, the first Christian school opened in Northern Iraq. There are now three Christian schools in the Kurdish region of Northern Iraq that serve as an outreach to the Muslim community. Dave continues to give oversight to the schools and is responsible for staffing, supplying curriculum, and giving overall leadership to the school. The sports program in the Iraqi schools is fully underway, and Dave asks for prayer for staff and the young athletes they seek to mentor through basketball training and friendship.
